

Love Thy Nature: Transforming our Most Vital Relationship

A discussion on the themes of **Love Thy Nature** — Sylvie's award-winning film narrated by Liam Neeson examining how deeply we've lost touch with nature and how a renewed connection with the natural world is key both to our personal health and the health of our planet.

Come Alive! How Nature-connection Impacts Physical and Mental Health

Sylvie takes the audience on an exploration of new scientific studies that show how nature-connection improves health, including its impact on the brain, from reducing stress levels to preventing depression. The practice of "Forest Bathing" inspired by "Shirin-Yoku" in Japan, is rapidly expanding in the West as an elemental and universal tool for preventive medicine.

Biomimicry: A Revolution Inspired by Nature

Can we develop advanced technologies without destroying our planet? Nature has been doing so for 4.5 billion years! On this talk, Sylvie offers astounding examples of how nature's "technologies" are significantly more advanced than our own and how leading Biomimicry scientists look to nature for some of the most brilliant and cutting-edge innovations.

Unleashing the Muse Within

Children often amuse us with their bursts of creative expression yet many adults believe they no longer possess or are limited in their creativity. This talk explores how to unlock our innate creativity through wild imagining, fun exercises and directions for simple activities to take our imagination to unexplored heights.

Shattering the Inner Glass Ceiling: Empowering Women to Fulfill Their Dreams

Film Director Sylvie Rokab shares her personal stories of growing up in Brazil, fighting "machismo" and ultimately manifesting her dreams of becoming a wildlife cinematographer and film director. This session offers female attendees tools to help transform old beliefs and become empowered agents of change in their own lives and in the world around them.

Mindful Filmmaking: How to Captivate Audiences with Visual Storytelling

In this workshop, Sylvie distills essential film production concepts to help attendees create and share their message powerfully on video — whether for board rooms, government agencies or global conferences. This fun, interactive and multi-media session shows how simple choices in narrative, camera angles and editing can maximize emotional impact, leaving audiences moved and inspired.

The Dream of Gaia: Finding and Manifesting Purpose

Yale Social Ecologist Stephen Kellert said, "All humans have an inherent need to find meaning and purpose in their lives... and have a sense that life has greater value than just being an isolated spec of matter..." Using meditation, contemplation, and forest bathing, this session offers participants tools to tap into their life passion and manifest it in a way that serves their own aspirations while being of service to the world.
